In the tri-state area, the Mass will air at 11 a.m. on WLNY-TV 55, Ch. 10 and on select CBS stations nationally, check your local listings.

Thank you again for embracing the Catholic mission exemplified by our Catholic Charities of Long Island and for your continued efforts to defeat COVID-19. You and your families will be remembered by me at the White Mass.
